Memorial Day 2018 The National Capital Chapter conducted the Association's Washington, DC Memorial Day observances from Friday, May 25 through May 28. The Deputy Commanding General, Support and Acting Division Commander Brigadier General K. Todd Royar, Chaplain, Lieutenant Colonel Sean Wead and a Division Honor Guard joined in the ceremonies. Observances began on Friday, May 25 when Chapter President George Malleck and Association Legal Advisor Emeritus John Fatherree laid the Association's wreath at a moving ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Arlington National Cemetery. On Saturday, May 26 the day began with a bus tour of the World War Two Memorial, the Korean War Memorial and the Vietnam Memorial Wall where wreaths were laid on behalf of the Association. George Malleck made remarks at the World War Two Memorial, Former Association President Dick Schonberger spoke at the Korean War Memorial and Chapter Vice President, Treasurer and Memorial and Veteran Day Coordinator Bob Ponzo spoke at the Vietnam Memorial Wall. At 3:00 PM, the annual remembrance ceremony was held at the 101stAirborne Memorial on Memorial Drive in Arlington National Cemetery. Brigadier General Royar gave the Memorial address. A wreath lay ceremony followed and Taps was played by a trumpeter from the Army Band. The Memorial Dinner followed at 5:00 PM at the Sheraton, Pentagon City, also the site of the Association hospitality suite. Brigadier General Royar gave a comprehensive briefing on the Division's activites and plans. Monday, May 28 was reserved for attendance at the National Memorial Day parade. It was great getting together with both old and new friends. Look forward to getting together again on Veterans Day



### Friday, May 22, 2020

3:00 PM – Hospitality Suite at the Sheraton Hotel will be open. 4:15 PM – Division Association wreath will be laid at the Tomb of the Unknowns

#### Saturday, May 23, 2020

9:30 AM – Bus leaves the hotel for the National Mall. Association wreaths will be laid at the WWII Memorial, the Korean War Memorial and the Vietnam Wall. Hospitality Suite will open upon return to the hotel.

3:00 PM – Memorial Ceremony, including laying of wreaths\* at the 101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division Memorial.

5:00 PM – Dinner served at the hotel. Hospitality Suite will re-open after the dinner.

#### Sunday, May 24, 2020

This will be a free day for visitors to partake in any of the many events taking place in the Metropolitan area.

11:00 AM – Hospitality Suite will open and remain open until 12 midnight (or later).

#### VETERANS DAY 2019:

The National Capital Area Chapter again hosted Veterans Day activities, 9 - 11 November, at the Vietnam Memorial Wall and the 101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division Monument at the entrance to Arlington National Cemetery. We began with a Hospitality Suite on the afternoon and evening of the 10<sup>th</sup> which was attended by veteran Screaming Eagles and their guests, as well as members of two local area chapters of the 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Division Association who had their hospitality suite in the same hotel (more on that later). On the 11<sup>th</sup> our **Chapter wreath** was placed at the Vietnam Memorial (The Wall) by Chapter President George Malleck, Gulf Coast Chapter President George W. Buck and NCAC member Mike Trochan as part of the National Ceremony honoring the more than 58,000 casualties listed on that Memorial. Following that ceremony the Chapter conducted a wreath laying at the 101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division Memorial at Arlington National Cemetery. Thirteen wreaths were placed honoring the following units and individuals: The 101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division (Air Assault); the National Association; MSGT Elvin W. Anderson; 327<sup>th</sup>/401<sup>st</sup> Infantry; Task Force 3/506<sup>th</sup> Airborne Infantry, Geraci Chapter; COL Leonard C. Krawczyk; CPL Peter Pulaski, Jr., 42<sup>nd</sup> Inf Plt – Scout Dog; Dennis L. Husereau 2/502d Infantry; MAJ Ivan Worrell, 1st Brigade Separate; LTC Charles K. Gailey, Past Chapter President; Chapter member COL Arthur P. Deverill; 2<sup>nd</sup> Bn 502<sup>nd</sup> Infantry; and PFC Joe E. Mann H Co 502<sup>nd</sup> PIR WWII, Medal of Honor.

The Chapter is again engaged in preparations for the 2020 Memorial Day Weekend in Washington, D.C. A schedule of events, registration form and wreath ordering form are located in another section of this magazine. It appears that the **AMVETS organization** will be sponsoring **three day motorcycle-themed demonstration rally** in Washington, D.C. this coming Memorial Day weekend to **replace** the annual **Rolling Thunder** celebration which drew countless thousands of participants to the nation's capital. The new event, titled "**the Rolling to Remember Demonstration Run**," will be conducted from **May 22<sup>nd</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup>** and will retain the old Event's focus on public awareness of troops still missing in action from overseas conflicts. Right now we are **unable to determine** if this will have the same **impact** on our Chapter's activities as **Rolling Thunder** did in past years. As yet there is **no information** concerning possible **street closings** and what dates those streets might be closed by Arlington County authorities. In view of the potential impact to our activities we have decided to keep the **full Saturday schedule** for both of our wreath laying ceremonies and the Memorial Dinner with **Sunday** again being a **free day**.

We mentioned earlier that two local chapters of the 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Division Association had a **Hospitality suite** in our same hotel for Veterans Day. The **Washington D.C. Chapter** were the **sponsors** this past August for the **82nd National Association** which held their annual reunion in the Washington D.C. metropolitan area attended by close to 500 personnel. That reunion was based out of the **Pentagon City Sheraton** hotel. Apparently the **relationship** between the **hotel** and the 82<sup>nd</sup> went extremely well resulting in the two local chapters using the hotel again in November. The Reuben H. Tucker Chapter from Maryland partnered with the D.C. chapter to conduct Veterans Day activities. Needless to say, members of both associations freely visited each other's hospitality suites and a lot of camaraderie and good fun resulted. There were a good number of members of the 82<sup>nd</sup> group who had in, the course of service and careers, also served with the **101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division**. Representatives of both 82<sup>nd</sup> chapters indicated that they were seriously considering using the Pentagon City Sheraton for their Veterans Day activities in the future. Their Veterans Dav program is similar to our Memorial Day program in that it lasted 3-4 days and resulted in the placement of almost three dozen wreaths in separate ceremonies during those days. Our chapter members were graciously invited to partake in these events and several of us did on our free Sunday and were impressed and honored that we had been invited.

The very **favorable interaction** between our two groups led to discussions of the possibility of conducting a joint **Hospitality Suite** on future **Veterans Days**. The **officers** of **both 82<sup>nd</sup> chapters** were positively inclined to establish coordination with our chapter to explore the potential benefits of such an endeavor and we intend to move forward in the coming months to see if this could be viable. Of **primary interest** would be the possibility of **sharing expenses** which might reduce costs to both theirs and our chapters. We will keep you posted on any progress that it made.
